Parish Directory: Father Tom, Christa Bomeli, Rosemary Herpel Christa Bomeli is the head of the Parish Directory committee. She reported to the PPC what her committee had come up with and discussed.

- ~Possible survey on what parish wants
- ~Like directory and pictures
- ~Rosemary said 7 parishes were contacted Our Lady of Guadalupe is the only parish doing a directory

Christa said the committee has three options.

- ~Option One: Booklet like Our Lady of Guadalupe (it was passed around); funded by advertisements; could be completed by the end of the year; can be updated yearly
- ~Option Two: We do equivalent to what we've done before (Life Touch 2016); photo directory, printed out, company does most of the heavy lifting schedules appointments on their own, offers online access but more information is needed from them; need more information on the cost. \$414/1500 people, \$717/3000 people
- ~Option Three: Online church directory, data is secure password protected, private, parishioners can upload own photo, one company, link to download PDF Premium \$154.88/year

- ~Willing to help people who don't have a computer or who aren't computer literate
- *John Pull current information from mailings
- *Sister Susan Change address admin. screen, people can change their information, or can church change?
- *Nora Is there a set up fee?
- *Father Tom Recommendation of committee? Last option (digital) plus PDF for homebound, allows people ownership

How do you know when new people join?

How can we find out about talents and interests?

We are such a welcoming community, we want to know about our parishioners.

- *Father Tom This is a perfect example of what PPC is about we have an idea, it goes to a committee and then they report back.
- *Lin Nice to have cost of booklet, option 2 is what we had in 2016
- *Sister Susan Cost of printing PDF, print yourself
- *John Digital option did you look at what they had, example one had a PDF, one had videos
- *Joel Who owns the digital file (secured cloud)
- *Barbara Who owns the electronic file (our data but lives in their computer)
- *Nora Ask family, ask those out of town
- *Father Tom Company should have reference list, recommendation of council go towards Option Three on recommendation of directory committee, helpful if we find at least one parish who has a digital program

Membership/Discernment: Barbara

- *4 members are leaving Parish Council after serving 2-2 year terms Joyce, Rosemary, Julianne, Lin
- *Invite potential new members to come to an April or May meeting
- *Look for younger people
- *May discernment
- *Committee makes some decisions before discernment
- *12 16 lay members, staff members
- *Bring names to committee, let us talk about those people, then we reach out
- *Father Tom Length of time in parish is a measuring stick, if interested may attend April/May meeting
- *Joyce (Patty agreed) Don't talk to people first, council discusses first, you feel called
- *Lin Discuss among selves

- *David put out notice, mention at Mass, this many slots, go through prayerful discernment
- *Rosemary New people need to really understand what this body is and is not; what is our role?
- *Father Tom Youth rep. is not part of 16, does not count in group size, must be member of church and initiated
- *Tom Pass names to Barbara

Mass Attendance: Father Tom

This discussion is a continuation from our February meeting.

- *Sister Susan National Catholic Reporter attendance in faith based organizations
- *Father Tom Part of the reason why people are not engaged in church is a lack of trust. CARA (Center for Applied Research) most recent survey greater attendance on Ash Wednesday than Christmas (Catholics across the USA); What is it that is attracting people on Ash Wednesday; What is competing?
- *Nora Our parish is welcoming. People are choosing other ways to get fulfilled. How do we fulfill our own parishioners and keep those that are here? (Rosemary agreed with Nora).
- *Lin Cleveland Clinic passes out ashes for all those who wanted them.
- *Father Tom The difference between Christmas and Ash Wednesday is the attraction that anyone can come and get ashes.
- *Rosemary Ahuja I was there on Ash Wednesday; people came.
- *Julianne On Ash Wednesday, people can come without attending a full Mass.
- *Matt Strange Rites documents how there are rituals without worship.
- *Patty Bulletin a place to see many opportunities and get involved.
- *Rosemary I often wonder...we offer a lot of things, but what is the depth of participation? We have good programs. Why are there only a few people who come and how can we increase attendance?
